

# Offence Data for Average Speed Camera Systems During Roadworks

Data till end of December 2019 and correct as of 10<sup>th</sup> January 2020

#### **Overview of Content**

Offence data for existing or recently concluded average speed camera systems, operated as part of the Scottish Safety Camera Programme, will be published here on a 3 monthly basis and will show data from Apr-11 (where applicable).

Each publication will be made approximately 2 weeks following the end of a quarter and offence data will be confined to calendar/operational year quarters (Jan-Mar, Apr-Jun, Jul-Sep, and Oct-Dec).

Due to the process for driver identification and prosecution and the fact that the data is taken from a live system, the data published is subject to change and previously published data will be refreshed at each publication. This usually affects data for the last 2 quarters although it can also affect previous quarters' data.

## **CURRENT**

## A9 Roadworks – Bankfoot

The existing 9.5km stretch of single carriageway will be widened to full dual carriageway standard, providing safe and guaranteed overtaking opportunities in both directions. To allow construction works to continue a reduced speed limit is in operation between Luncarty to Bankfoot where average speed cameras have been in operation since the 20<sup>th</sup> of May 2019.

## A90 Roadworks – Balmedie and Blackdog

On 25<sup>th</sup> July 2016 the A90 roadworks average speed cameras went live between Balmedie and Blackdog. The reduced speed limit was set at 50mph to ensure the safety of road users and the workforce during the construction of this section of the Aberdeen Western Peripheral Route (AWPR). The average speed cameras are expected to stay in place until the works are completed. This section is due for completion in spring 2017.

The average speed cameras are expected to stay in place until the works are completed. This section is due for completion in winter 2017/18.
